

TIMBERTOP CAMP

Timbertop is an overnight camp designed for youth ages 8-14 that have been identified by their School District as needing extra help for a special learning need. Specific learning disabilities may include: OHI, ADHD, ADD, LD and SLD. Youth receiving support services such as Leveled Learning Intervention (LLI), Reading Support and Title 1, are also eligible. Timbertop combines traditional camp activities with extra reading practice and special group activities that focus on dealing with learning differences in a structured daily setting. We are dedicated to providing a safe, fun and small group environment, which develops the spirit, mind and body of each individual. Camp is a special place where youth and teens learn about the environment, develop positive values, make meaningful friendships, build positive peer relationships, learn new skills and increase self-confidence. In our community of caring adults Timbertop summer camp helps kids grow and find themselves. Parents and teachers of campers have been overwhelmingly positive about the experience their children have had while at camp.

Timbertop was founded in 1967. This year we will be celebrating the 56th anniversary of Timbertop! Timbertop Camp, Inc. is a registered 501(c)3 Tax Exempt Organization operated by a volunteer board of directors dedicated to serving youth with learning disabilities. **This summer Timbertop will be offered August 6-11, 2023** and held at the Wisconsin Lions Camp, located in Rosholt Wisconsin just 20 miles North-East of Stevens Point.

The Founder and Co-Director of Timbertop is Rhoda Brooks "Wings". Rhoda holds an M.A. in Special Education and has over 35 years of teaching and administrative experience; she retired from teaching in Waconia, Minnesota. Nancy Reuter "Spirit" has worked at Timbertop since 1992 and has been a special and regular education teacher since 1995 in Mosinee, Wisconsin. Pete Matthai, Camp Director, has been a Timbertop Camp staff since 1991. He has a B.S. degree in Youth Programming and Camp Management from UWSP. Also joining us this year will be many other professional volunteers. We are always looking for additional volunteers.
