

What is Timbertop?

Timbertop Camp is a overnight camp designed for boys and girls, ages 8-14, who have been identified by their school districts as needing extra help for a special learning need. Specific identification categories may include: SLD, LD, ADD, ADHD, OHI, and Title 1.

Timbertop combines traditional camp activities with extra reading practice and special group activities that focus on dealing with learning differences in a structured daily setting. Emphasis is placed on peer relations, building self-confidence, learning new skills to share at home and of course, having fun; all in a non-competitive outdoor setting.

Our History

This year we will be celebrating the 57th anniversary of Timbertop! Timbertop was founded in 1967 to provide a specialized camping experience for children with learning disabilities. Timbertop Camp, Inc. is a registered 501(c)3 Tax Exempt organization operated by a Volunteer Board of Directors.

Camp Location

Camp is held at the Wisconsin Lions Camp, 20 miles northeast of Stevens Point in Rosholt WI on Beautiful Lions Lake.

The Wisconsin Lions Camp is dedicated to providing quality camp experiences for Wisconsin youth and adults with disabilities.



Timbertop Campers stay in the Lions Camp Conference and Retreat Center/Cabins and supervised by Timbertop Camp volunteers. Base camp programming is provided by the Lions Camp staff.

Camp Details

Timbertop is a 6 day outdoor adventure where campers will learn outdoor skills and participate in activities designed to enhance their cooperative abilities and interpersonal relationships. An emphasis is placed on building self-esteem and how to make and

keep friends. Whether building a campfire, cleaning the cabin or learning how to handle a canoe, each camper learns to share the responsibility of camp life. Daily activities include: camp classes



(such as nature exploration, canoeing & kayaking, arts & crafts, archery, fishing and camp games), teambuilding, reading instruction, swimming, cabin activities, evening campfires, stargazing and all-camp programs.
