What is Timbertop?

Timbertop Camp is a overnight camp designed for boys and girls, ages 8-14, who have been identified by their school districts as needing extra help for a special learning need. Specific identification categories may include: SLD, LD, ADD, ADHD, OHI, and Title 1.

Timbertop combines traditional camp activities with extra reading practice and special group activities that focus on dealing with learning differences in a structured daily setting. Emphasis is placed on peer relations, building self-confidence, learning new skills to share at home and of course, having fun; all in a non-competitive outdoor setting.

Our History

This year we will be celebrating the 59th anniversary of Timbertop! Timbertop was founded in 1967 to provide a specialized camping experience for children with learning disabilities. Camp Timbertop, Inc. is a registered 501(c)3 Tax Exempt organization operated by a Volunteer Board of Directors.



Camp Location



Camp is being held at YMCA Camp Glacier Hollow, 14 miles east of Stevens Point in Amherst Jct. WI on Beautiful Lake Elaine.

YMCA Camp Glacier Hollow is operated by the Stevens Point Area YMCA dedicated to Youth Development, Healthy Living and Social Responsibility.

Campers are supervised by Timbertop Camp volunteers with facilities and programming provided by YMCA Camp Glacier Hollow.

Camp Details

Timbertop is a 6 day outdoor adventure where campers will learn outdoor skills and participate in activities designed to enhance their cooperative abilities and interpersonal relationships. An emphasis is placed on building self-esteem and how to make and keep friends. Whether building a campfire, cleaning the cabin or learning how to handle a canoe, each camper learns to share the responsibility of camp life. Daily activities include: camp classes (such as nature exploration, canoeing & kayaking, arts & crafts, archery, fishing and camp games), teambuilding, reading instruction, swimming, cabin activities, evening campfires, stargazing and all-camp programs.

Arrive between 2:00 and 3:30 pm on Sunday and depart at 4:00 pm on Friday. An awards ceremony is held at 3:00 pm on Friday.

You will be notified of your child's acceptance after we review your application and school information. Eligibility is based on Camp being able to meet the needs of each child.

Camp Leadership

Camp Timbertop is operated by a volunteer Board of Directors. Our volunteers/staff are selected for their leadership skills and their ability to provide a meaningful and safe camp experience for youth with Learning Disabilities. Volunteers/Staff have an understanding of youth with special needs and the unique potential of each child. **There is a ratio of one adult to every six campers.**

The Camp Founder, Rhoda Brooks "Wings", holds an M.A. in Special Education and has over 30 years of teaching and administrative experience. Nancy Reuter "Spirit" has worked with Timbertop since 1992 and is a special and regular education teacher in Mosinee, WI.
